## Programs @ the Gardner-Harvey Library!

September-October 2014 promises to be an enriching time for the campus and community. The Gardner-Harvey Library will offer two program series this fall; both free and open to the public made possible through the National Endowment for the Humanities and partners. Consider ways you might incorporate these opportunities into your coursework.

### Changing America: The Emancipation Proclamation, 1863 and the March on Washington, 1963

Smithsonian exhibition will be displayed for 6 weeks in the Gardner-Harvey Library, starting September 10, 2014. Programs include an opening reception, half day seminar, African-American musical heritage, and Freedom Summer.



The final two documentary/discussions will be held in the Created Equal: America's Civil Rights Struggle. Dr. Dich will facilitate **The Abolitionists** on September 22 while Dr. Androne will present **Slavery by Another Name** on October 14. Both current films depict the lives and conditions of those who fought and suffered for freedom in America.

## Want to Try 3D Printing?

Yes, you can print your own 3D items at the Gardner-Harvey Library! The Library staff offers 3D printing consultations for Miami students, faculty, and staff on the following days and times (the actual printing may happen during other time periods):

- Tuesday, 10:00am-2:00pm
- Wednesday, 1:00pm-5:00pm
- Thursday, 4:00pm-7:00pm

Consultations will be provided on a first-come, first-served basis. Generally, 3D printing for class projects or educational purposes will take precedence over personal printing. The Library staff reserves the right to approve items for printing.

3D printing charges are based on the time it takes to print an item. Charges will be applied in the following increments:

- Under 30 minutes is free
- 31 minutes to 1 hour is \$1.00
- 1 hour, 1 minute to 2 hours is \$2.00
- 2 hours, 1 minute to 3 hours is \$3.00
- 3 hours, 1 minute to 4 hours is \$4.00
- 4 hours, 1 minute to 8 hours is \$5.00



Items requiring more than eight hours to print will require the approval of the Library staff. The final cost will be determined upon job completion.

## Making a Makerspace: We Need Your Ideas!

In addition to the 3D printer, the library is exploring other technologies and activities aimed at learning through making stuff. We have added a button maker, a laser cutter, soldering irons, lights and microphones, and some electronics and programming kits. If you have other ideas, please let us know!
