New Technology



Have you seen our Podcast Kit or our videoconferencing Owl? With sound board, head sets, and microphones, our podcast kit offers a complete sound setup for your podcasting or other audio recording needs.

The Owl is a 360-degree video conferencing device that automatically focuses on whoever in the room is speaking and features a built-in speaker so virtual participants can be heard without any feedback or echo. It can capture audio and video of participants up to 18 feet away.



Both our podcast kit and the Owl are available for checkout at the InfoDesk in the library.
