NAVIGATING THE INFORMATION UNIVERSE

How Do Regional Students Purchase, Access, and Use Textbooks?



In February 2023, 297 Regional students completed a survey on their experiences with textbooks at the start of the Spring 2023 semester. The results are still being analyzed, but initial findings show:

- 54% of respondents spent between \$101 and \$300 on their course materials for Spring 2023. 23% spent \$301 or more.
- 42% of respondents were either moderately or extremely worried about meeting their course material costs for the semester.
- To save costs, 74% of respondents buy used copies of textbooks, 57% find free versions online, and 20% borrow a copy from the campus library.
- Respondents were taking an average of 4.5 courses during the semester, and on average 3 courses had required course materials. Respondents, on average, purchased materials for 1.5 courses and rented materials for 1.3 courses. 30% of respondents reported not purchasing materials for any of their courses, and 38% did not rent any materials.
- 41% of respondents either frequently or occasionally do not purchase required textbooks for courses. 13 % of respondents either frequently or occasionally earned a poor grade in a course because they could not afford to buy the textbook.
- 83% of respondents have had a class where an instructor did not require a purchased course material, and instead assigned readings or activities from other sources (including open textbooks, articles from the library, videos, etc.).
- 66% of respondents prefer printed textbooks, 57% prefer downloadable e-books or PDFs, and 49% prefer online e-books.

The Regional Libraries are constantly looking for ways to support students' needs for course materials. We offer a selection of <u>textbooks on reserve</u>, help faculty find <u>open</u> <u>textbooks and other materials</u> for their course readings and viewings, and seek out materials online and from our library partners at OhioLINK. We'll share the full results from the survey when they are available, and we are happy to answer any questions you have about textbooks and other course materials.
